


TETON HIGH ADVENTURE BASE



Teton High Adventure Base is a BSA nationally accredited high adventure base located near Jackson, WY with easy access to Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks.

WHY HIGH ADVENTURE?

Youth need to develop the skills and character that will help them become productive, successful members of society.

The Boy Scouts of America teaches youth life skills and shapes their character by showing them how to make good decisions based on the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

High Adventure programs provide a testing ground for youth to practice making meaningful decisions in an environment where they face and overcome real risks.

These programs foster the development of decision-making skills, increase self-confidence, and improve self-reliance.

The Teton High Adventure Base programs provide the resources for these experiences. This includes trained guides who are experienced in leading youth through these challenging activities.

PLANNING YOUR VISIT

Teton High Adventure Base opens the third week of June and closes the second week of August.

Two three-day sessions are offered each week. Full-week sessions are available.

Monday to Wednesday sessions arrive on Monday before noon with activities beginning on Monday afternoon. This session concludes with dinner and departure on Wednesday evening.

Thursday to Saturday sessions arrive on Wednesday evening after 7:00 p.m. with activities beginning on Thursday morning. The session concludes with lunch on Saturday.

INDIVIDUAL ATTENDEES

For youth whose groups are not attending the Teton High Adventure Base, we offer the chance to attend as part of a provisional group during a Monday - Wednesday session. This includes bus transportation from Salt Lake City and pre-determined activities. See the website for further details.

HOUSING AND MEALS

Participants are housed in one of our bunkhouses or in tents provided by the base. Foam pads are provided.

All meals are provided at the base kitchen.

TRANSPORTATION

Groups can provide their own transportation to Teton High Adventure Base.

Groups may also take advantage of our round-trip bus service between Salt Lake City and Teton HAB.

Reservations are accepted online at www.saltlakescouts.org/camps/, by phone at (801)582-3663 or at a Great Salt Lake Council Service Center.

A \$50 per person non-refundable, non-transferable deposit is due at registration.

Groups create their own program by selecting from the activities provided. A combination of full and half day options fill out five activity periods. Based on the activities that you select, our staff will create a schedule for your stay.
