Leadership

Two registered adult leaders or one registered leader and a parent of a participant (one of whom must be 21 years of age or older), must be with each unit at all times. This is in keeping with "*Guide to Safe Scouting*" for all outings. At least one registered adult who has completed *BSA Youth Protection Training* must be present at all events and activities that require a tour permit. **An approved tour permit is required for this activity.**

Unit Campsite

A campsite location will be identified for each unit within your district's assigned area. 11-year old Scouts are part of the troop and camp in the unit's camping area. **Webelos who stay overnight must have a parent or guardian with them.**

Safety Precautions

Appropriate cautions must be employed for all activities in accordance with BSA "*Guide To Safe Scouting*."

Each Scout Unit Youth Leader should insure that all Scouts use the **buddy system**. **No Scout should be alone.**

All Scouts and Leaders should stay on the Park property during the Jamboral.

No youth is permitted to sleep in the tent of an adult other than his own parent or guardian. Youth should sleep in tents together. Adults should sleep in tents together. Adult leaders must respect the privacy of youth members and must protect their own privacy.

BSA policy is "no open flames in tents." No tent material is completely fireproof. It can burn when exposed to continued, intense heat or fire. Only flashlights or electric lanterns are permitted in tents.

Please **DO NOT** bring footballs, frisbees, or other sports equipment to the encampment. In order to insure the safety of all participants any of these items found in use will be confiscated. These items have proven to be dangerous when used within this large of a group.

Fires – No Open Fires Allowed – Cooking Must Be with Propane Stoves. No charcoal is permitted.

No open fires will be permitted. **This is a no trace camping area.** Since fires are prohibited, wood cutting tools should not be in the campsite. If other wood items are needed for your campsite set-up, please ring them pre-cut. **CONSIDER PREPARING SIMPLE MEALS!**

First Aid

Each unit is responsible to provide basic first aid care to unit members beginning with each Scout having his own basic first aid kit and personal medications as required. Each Scouting district will have a first aid station staffed with qualified personnel who can assist unit leaders in meeting first aid needs. The council will have a first aid station manned Saturday, 8 AM to 3 PM during the Jamboral. They will be able to assist in cases where the first aid need is beyond the ability of the district to provide aid.

Unit Equipment

Each unit is responsible for providing their own equipment for their stay at the Jamboral. This is a back packing camp. All equipment will need to be **packed in** and **packed out**. NO digging of holes in the ground. Only **8 inch tent stakes or smaller** are to be used for tents or parameter use. Please watch out for water lines. Do not tie ropes to County facilities, fencing, poles, or objects.
