What is a Unit Visit?

- It's a Unit Commissioner's visit to one of her/his assigned units.

What constitutes a visit?

- Attendance at a Pack, Troop, Team or Crew Meeting, or a conference with the Institutional Head or Chartered Organization Representative (COR).

Why is it important?

- It's a source of information and support for the adult leaders of the unit.
- It keeps the Commissioner informed as to progress and problems of the unit and the boys.
- It's another way of showing that others care about the unit, the adult leaders, and the boys.

How and how often?

- Prior to a visit, a Commissioner reviews Commissioner Visit Worksheet records for follow-up items and ideas of things to look for in the visit.
- The Commissioner makes sure the time is convenient and appropriate.
- The visit should be made in uniform.
- The Commissioner can be introduced at beginning of meeting, but no speeches or other participation should follow.
- The visit should last the entire meeting.
- Commissioners ask if there are any problems they can help with.

Is the visit reported? Yes!

- Strength and weakness, successes and problems are escalated as follows:
Unit Commissioner → Zone Commissioner → District Commissioner → Council Commissioner.
- Escalation includes reporting to LDS/BSA and Community/BSA Relationship Committees.
- Unit Visits are an ingredient in the "Quality Leader" recognition and "Quality Unit" awards.

What then?

- The Unit Commissioner follows up on things asked for by the leader(s).
- The Unit Commissioner periodically fills out a Commissioner Visit Worksheet for the unit(s) and keeping them private, uses them for future reference.
- The Unit Commissioner reports to the Zone Commissioner or District Commissioner starting the escalation process.
