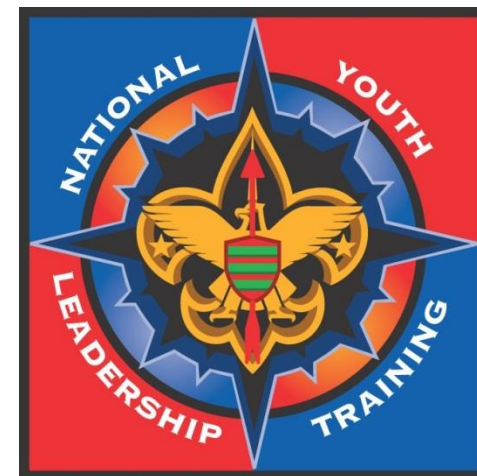

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is NYLT?

National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting, action-packed program designed for councils to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops/teams/crews and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

Units now should train their youth leaders using the new Introduction to Leadership Skills (ILS) syllabus. When a young man/woman completes Introduction to Leadership Skills, he may then qualify to take the Council NYLT Course.

As an adult, how does NYLT benefit my unit?

NYLT is similar to the Wood Badge syllabus. Youth leaders trained through NYLT return to their units with the same or similar skills as those taught to adult leaders at Wood Badge. Imagine an adult Scouting leader and a youth leader both trained with the same skills leading a unit. The synergy is there to make a bigger difference in how your unit will function.

What can I expect at NYLT?

The staff of NYLT is committed to making it a great experience. You will live in a patrol setting where you will use your skills to lead and develop your team. The week concludes with each patrol developing and presenting their vision of the meaning of leadership.

What will I get out of NYLT?

Every participant will take home the self-confidence, skills, ability, and motivation to lead other youth and himself, through practical application of NYLT skills. You will learn skills such as conflict resolution, stages of team development, how to teach others, and geocaching. You will set goals for yourself and your home unit to share with your Scouting leader.

WHAT IS REQUIRED TO QUALIFY TO ATTEND NYLT?

- Be currently registered as a member of Boy Scouts of America as a Scout, Varsity or Venturer.
- Have completed **Introduction to Leadership Skills (ILS)** for troop, team or crew.
- Be in good physical condition (Health and Medical Form required)
- Be a minimum age of **13 years old and hold the rank of 1st Class or higher.**
- Be a current or prospective youth leader recommended by their adult leader.
- Have completed a week-long scouting camp (family camping does not qualify).
- Own and wear a complete Scout uniform including: shirt, pants, socks, and belt, and have all badges properly placed.

FEES: Early Bird signup fee of \$165 per participant. Fees include meals, patrol equipment, participant book, t-shirt, and program supplies. A \$50 non-refundable deposit will hold your spot for the designated course. Fee must be paid in full one week before course begins and a late sign-up fee of \$180 will start May 1st.
