Tips for a Proper Flag Ceremony

The US Flag is always on the right during a procession and crosses in front of any other flags to be displayed at the left of the room. Salute the flag anytime the flag is in motion and until the last note of the National Anthem. The flag should never be dipped (unless the height of the room requires it) and should never touch the ground. It is to be the largest flag and the highest flag displayed. When using a flag pole, the flag should be raised quickly and lowered slowly, saluting the whole time. The US flag is always the first to be raised and last to be lowered.

There are differing opinions on whether the color guard is to salute the flag and say the pledge. Make a decision as a pack and inform the parents so they aren't giving different instructions to their boys. Either way, if the scout is holding the flag or raising it, they are not to salute, but can after the flag is raised or posted. Explain that the salute should be held until 'two' which symbolizes the second part of the salute (hand up - one, hand down - two). Official scout hats may be worn during the ceremony, but all other hats should be removed. The most important thing is to teach respect for the flag: especially by the proper wearing of the uniform and the attitude with which it is handled.
