Tracy Winter Day Camp Leader Orientation Guide

Welcome to Tracy Winter Camp located at the Tracy Training Center approximately 2 miles east of the toll booth on Millcreek Canyon Road (3 800 South).

Please take a few moments to read this guide in preparation for your day camp.

LEADERSHIP

Each pack provides its own adult leadership. At least two registered adult leaders should accompany each group. Two-deep leadership could also be provided by one registered adult leader and one parent.

YOUR RESERVATION

When you made your reservation, you should have paid for the number of people attending.

If your group size changes, please change your reservation *before* you come to camp. Making additions at camp can lead to overcrowding of program areas, which diminishes the camp experience for everyone.

You can change your reservation by calling the Camping & Activities Desk at (801) 582-3663; or by stopping by one of our service centers in person.

CLOTHING

Air temperatures during winter camp are rarely above freezing (32°F).

Prior to departing for camp, please be sure that each participant has warm clothing, a warm hat and gloves. We strongly recommend layering clothing with a waterproof layer on the outside.

Winter boots are also strongly recommended. If they are not available, extra shoes and socks are a must.

TOUR PLAN

Great Salt Lake Council units do not need to file a tour plan for this activity. Units from other councils should file a tour plan at their council service center.

TUBING HILL

The tubing hill is a favorite activity area at winter camp. It is also the most dangerous. The Tubing Hill Safety Rules were approved by the risk management committee and will be in effect at winter camp. They are as follows:

1. Only one person per tube. Only one tube at a time. No chaining.
2. When riding a tube you must ride with your feet first.
3. When returning to the top of the hill walk up the trail and not on the tubing hill.
4. At the top of the hill, wait until you are cleared before going down the hill.
5. Only inflatable tubes are to be used.
6. The stems on the tubes are to be facing down when the tube is in use.
7. As soon as you stop at the bottom of the hill, move quickly out of the way.
8. Do not build jumping ramps.

The tubing hill is open only when camp staff are present to monitor the flow. Scouts should refrain from tubing at other times.

These items are PROHIBITED on the tubing hill.



Snowboards are also prohibited.

These items are APPROVED on the tubing hill:



Inflatable truck inner tubes or their commercial counterpart.

An air compressor will be available at camp to inflate your tubes. **You must bring your own tubes.**

CHECK IN AT CAMP

You may check in at the Tracy Training Center beginning at 8:30 AM. Please bring a BSA medical history (parts A & B) for each participant and a completed unit roster. We also recommend that you bring a copy of your reservation receipt, especially if you have made changes in the 24 hour period preceding your camp.

FOOD

Our winter camp staff will prepare and serve your lunch in Tracy Lodge. All utensils, plates, cups, etc. are provided.

TRADING POST

A small trading post will be available in the Tracy Lodge during winter camp. A small selection of snacks, drinks and souvenirs will be available.

ACTIVITIES

When you arrive at camp, pre-opening activities will be available for the boys prior to the opening ceremony. Following the opening ceremony, you will be divided into groups and a member of our staff will escort you to your activity area. Activity areas last for 30 minutes with the exception of tubing, which lasts for one hour.

CHECK OUT

Before you leave, be sure to pick-up your patches and medical forms from the camp director.

REFUNDS

The council expends resources prior to camp in order to provide staff, food and equipment for camp. Participants, therefore, must make a financial commitment in advance of camp.

Cancellations made at least one month before your scheduled camp date will receive a full refund.

Cancellations made within one month of your camp date will receive a 50% refund.

No refund will be made for cancellations made at camp or for groups who do not show up.
