Information**

Date: January 18-19, 2013

Location: East Canyon Reservoir State Park (10 mi S of Morgan or 9 mi W of Henefer)

Registration: Registration begins December 13, 2012 and ends January 19, 2013. Register at December and January Roundtables. You may mail registration to: 2013 Klondike Derby, c/o Phil Hudman, 886 Mountain View Rd. Centerville, UT 84014. You may also register at the event site upon arrival. Please fill out and return pages 6 and 7 with monies.

Note: Registration includes a nominal East Canyon State Park use fee, GSLC insurance fee, and facilities rental. A 10% Early Bird discount (prior to January 10, 2013) to reduce your costs (does not apply to patches). Fees are transferable, but not refundable. Vehicles arriving Saturday morning will need to pay the camp fee.

Uniform: Scouts and Leaders are not required to wear a full uniform at this event. However, all are expected to dress appropriately for weather conditions and wear uniforms if possible, especially while traveling.

Campsite: It is our privilege to return once again to East Canyon State Park. As good Scouts, the following rules will be observed:

- 1) Fires must be confined to fire pits and barbeque stands in campsites or in individual fire barrels at least 18” above the ground. Units are responsible to provide their own fire barrels and firewood. No firewood with nails.
- 2) All non-burnable garbage and ashes must be hauled out by each unit
- 3) Water is the responsibility of each unit. No water is available at the park.
- 4) No hay or straw is allowed in the park or in the campsites.
- 5) Campsites must be kept clean and orderly during the event.
- 6) Snowmobiles may **not** be operated by any Scout during this district-sponsored camp. Machines are restricted to designated use areas only and may not be used in camping areas. Utah State laws and regulations apply to (adult) operators.
- 7) Ice fishermen must abide by Utah State Wildlife laws and regulations and must have a valid license.
- 8) Defacing or damaging facilities such as restrooms or shelters will result in severe penalties.
- 9) Parking is limited. Please keep the number of vehicles in your group to a minimum and park only in designated areas. You may not park in roadways.
- 10) Do not trespass on private property around the park; i.e., across the roadway or beyond fences.
- 11) **No hand warmers, per Park Service request. LEAVE-NO-TRACE camping!**

Awards: Winning patrols will be awarded special recognition. Klondike events are designed to reinforce basic Scout skills and encourage patrol spirit. Awards will be presented on Saturday, immediately following the events.

Conduct: Each Scout and Leader will conduct himself in accordance with the Scout Oath and Law. Unsafe or inappropriate behaviors will result in the Scout or Leader being asked to leave. Please conduct yourselves in accordance with the Guidelines from The Guide to Safe Scouting. District events provide an opportunity for us to show off our best Scouting spirit and traditions.

Lake Ice Safety: Lake ice conditions change constantly and will not be fully known until arrival. Each unit is responsible for properly instructing members in safety and supervising Scouts when close to the lake. Avoid getting wet or being too close to open water or other dangerous circumstances. Use the buddy system while at camp.

Eleven-Year-: Eleven year old Scouts may participate in all Klondike events on both Friday and Saturday. All participants must be registered by 8:30am Saturday at district headquarters to participate in the skills games, and will compete against other 11 year old units.

Tour Permit: Evidence of a valid tour permit must be demonstrated at camp check-in.

Medical Forms: BSA Medical forms need to be easily accessible in case of a medical incident.

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Schedule

Friday, January 18, 2011

3:00 to 8:00 pm Troops arrive and set up camp. All units will be met and provided with campsite directions upon arrival. Registrations will be completed at district headquarters (main pavilion,). In order to participate, each unit must be fully registered with fees paid. Don't forget your Tour Plan.

Meal preparation and cleanup

7:30 to 10:00 pm Troop activity time

9:30 pm Scout Leader Cracker barrel at district headquarters,. Park rules require that all Scouts be in camp and quiet by 10:30 p.m.

10:30 pm All troops and patrols return to their own camps – leaders (adult and youth) must keep track of their Scouts at all times.

11:00 pm Lights out. Leaders are responsible to see that all Scouts are in their tents and are quiet. This is a matter of courtesy for other units. Remember, "a Scout is courteous."

Saturday, January 19, 2011

6:30 to 8:30 am Rise and shine! Prepare breakfast, cleanup, pack sleeping gear, and prepare for events.

8:30 am Patrol Leaders meet at district headquarters to receive final instructions and scorecards

8:45 am Flag Ceremony and event kickoff

9:00 to 11:30 am Patrol competition events.
Leaders and parents are welcome to view the Scouts in action, but any leader interference or involvement during the event will result in immediate patrol disqualification for the event.

12:00 Noon Awards ceremony at district headquarters

12:15 to 3:30 pm Lunch, break camp, stay and enjoy any planned troop *and District* activities. Troops may remain at the park until 3:30 p.m.

Please drive carefully to and from the Klondike Derby. No Scouts on snowmobiles. Obey all traffic laws and regulations (absolutely no riding in the back of trucks or bumper surfing!) and remember that each participant must wear a seat belt. It is a state law and a requirement of the tour plan.

Order of the Arrow/Varsity Teams:

Currently registered Arrowmen and Varsity Team or Venture Crew members (youth and adult) are invited to attend. They will be assisting with campsite assignments, skills games and events, and general camp orderliness.

Some events are a little more serious in nature, while the rest are just intended to let you enjoy the wonderful winter weather and have a great time at the Klondike. So let off a little bit of steam and get into the flow of the activities – you’ll find some challenges ahead while keeping warm!

List of Events (These are subject to change as needed per each Stake):

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|-------------------------|--|
| Skeleton Figuring | Test your skills on identifying wildlife found in the area. This event will be put on by Centerville Stake. |
| Pioneer Knotting | So you know your knots, do you? Well, you’ll have to prove your patrol can tie any one of the First Class knots correctly. This event will be put on by the Farmington West Stake. |
| Freestyle Doctoring | Let’s see how well you can assess and treat specific winter-related ailments. This event will be put on by the Farmington Oakridge Stake. |
| Primitive Fire Starting | How fast can you build a fire hot enough to burn through a string tied above your fire ring. This event will be put on by the Farmington North Stake. |
| Nordic Combined | How far is it to cross that river? How high is that particular landmark? (Handbook, pg. 122). This event will be put on by the Farmington South Stake. |
| Problem Jumping | How well can your patrol work together to solve a problem? This event will be put on by the Canyon View Stake. |
| Curling Hurling | How well can your patrol hit the mark with a snowball. Each member of your patrol will get the opportunity to hit the target. Best score will be highest average of each patrol. This event will be put on by the Farmington Stake. |
| Memory Sledding | Test your memory skills as a patrol. This event will be put on by the Centerville North Stake. |
| Short Track Speed Race | This annual event features your own patrol sled in a race to secure the fastest time. You’ll have to designate the ‘dogs’ and a ‘musher.’ The idea behind this race is to be the fastest to negotiate the course the OA has devised for you. Sled plans are available on the internet. Do a google search and pick one that suits your fancy. Each troop must have at least one sled which may be shared by patrols. |

We’re up here to have some fun and interact with other scouts. We want this to be a boys event, so leaders, please prepare before you arrive. If any leaders “interfere” with the boys competition their patrol/troop will automatically be disqualified from that event. Come up the mountain, and we will have some winter fun together. You’ll like the change of pace even though the pace will not let up. You’ll still want to prepare and do your best!

Each patrol will need to bring: Sled with pull ropes or push poles, Patrol First Aid Supplies for each patrol.

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Directions

Directions and map to East Canyon Reservoir State Park:

From Kaysville, Farmington, and Centerville, drive north on US-89 to the I-84 junction at the mouth of Weber Canyon.

Option 1 - Proceed east on I-84 approximately 16 miles to exit 103, Morgan. Drive south through town on US-66 to East Canyon, North Marina campground.

Option 2 - Proceed east on I-84 approximately 25 miles to exit 112, Henefer. Drive two miles south to town and then south on US-65 to turnoff. Keep right at turnoff and proceed to East Canyon, North Marina campground.

ATTACHMENT D

This is a Waiver and Release Form for participation in a Division of Utah State Parks and Recreation sponsored event or program.
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Description of event or program:

Injury may result from your participation in this event/program. Additionally, property damage or loss may occur. You are expected to familiarize yourself with the rules of conduct for the event/program as well as Division of Utah State Parks and Recreation policies. You are expected to follow proper operating procedures including safety procedures, plus any directions given by an authorized park or event/program coordinator employee.

The undersigned, being at least 18 years of age, and in consideration of participation in a state park event/program as described above hereinafter “event/program,” does hereby agree to this waiver and release.

I do hereby agree to assume all risks, which may be associated with or may result from my participation in this event/program, including but not limited to the actual course of activities or while using the facility, parking lots, transportation or access to state park facilities and recreation sites.

I recognize that participation in the event/program may involve moderate to strenuous physical activity and may cause physical and or emotional distress to participants. There may also be associated health risks. I state that I am free from any known heart, respiratory or other health problems that could prevent me from safely participating in any of the activities.

I certify that I have medical insurance or otherwise agree to be personally responsible for costs of any emergency or other medical care that I receive. I agree to release the State of Utah, Division of Utah State Parks and Recreation and its agencies, departments, officers, employees, agents and all sponsors, officials and staff or volunteers from the cost of any medical care that I receive as a result of participation in the event/program.

I further agree to release the State of Utah, Division of Utah State Parks and Recreation and its agencies, departments, officers, employees, agents and all sponsors, officials and staff or volunteers from any and all liability, claims, demands, breach of warranty, negligence, actions, and causes of actions whatsoever for any loss, claim, damage, injury, illness, attorney’s fees or harm of any kind or nature to me arising out of my participation in the event/program. This release extends to any claim made by my family, estate, heirs, or assigns arising from or in any way connected with the aforementioned activities.

CONSENT

Consent is expressly given, in the event of injury, for any emergency aid, anesthesia and / or operation, if in the opinion of the attending physician, such treatment is necessary.
