Location: Hyrum State Park (Group Campground)

Trading Post: The district trading post will be open Friday before and after campfire, and before and after activities Saturday. We will have drinks (hot & cold), treats, hand-warmers, and patches.

Klondike Leadership: As the long-time camp chairman, I have been trying to find a way to breath new life into our district camping program. I have come to realize that we were missing an important element of scouting. We were not modeling the patrol method or boy-led scouting. In an effort to correct this oversight, we have created a new model for district camps. We have a group of young scouts who have helped plan this camp, and will be the 'leadership patrol' for camps. Capture the Flag: Join your fellow scouts in a camp-wide game of capture the flag. The district will provide flags. You provide the fun. Several games will be played. Come join whenever you are ready.

Campfire: Come dressed in your best beach attire (speedos and wet t-shirts not recommended), for our beachwear fashion-show & contest. Any beach is fine: California, Hawaii, Carribean, etc. Prizes will be awarded for the best beachwear. Please also come prepared to share you favorite beach songs, skits, and stories. We'll do our best to have enough warm fire for everyone to enjoy the fun. Following the campfire we will have piñatas.

‘Sand’ Castles: We should have plenty of white ‘sand’. Who can make the best castle/sculpture? Plan ahead for your sculpting needs. If the 'sand' is too dry and not sticking together, what can be done? Is there something you can do to 'set' your sculpture so that it will stay in the shape you have made? Are there tools or decoration supplies you can bring? With this type of white 'sand' that we have, color is easy to add, you just have to plan ahead and bring supplies. Prizes will be awarded.

Bombard the Castle: The camp will be divided into two teams. During the morning activities each team will need to build a fort/castle. At the appointed time each team will be given a ‘cannon-ball’, for use in attacking and destroying the enemy fort. The teams will have to figure out how to defend their own fort while getting the cannon-ball to the enemy fort.

Volleyball: ‘Beach’ Volleyball will be available for play during the morning activities. We supply the net and ball. You supply the fun.

Beach Ball Relay: As troops are gathering for morning activities we will have a Beach-Ball Relay. Half the fun is not knowing what to prepare for, so we aren’t going to tell you any more details.

Beach Rescue Relay: You are the beach rescue team. Use your sled as a water-rescue vehicle. Once you get the victim to shore, provide first aid (the exact injury/ailment will not be revealed until you get there), then use a proper rescue carry technique to move the victim across the tidepools and rocks to the ambulance, then drive the ambulance to the ER.

Traditional Klondike: You may be asking, ‘What happened to the traditional Klondike games and sled race?’ Those will be back another time. This year, we have decided to change it up a bit. Instead of a bunch of activities/games that emphasize ‘1st Class Fundamentals’, we felt it would be good to have a camp where we focus more on the team, scouting fellowship, and fun.

Other Information:

All Scouts must be registered.

Bring your own water and firewood.

All fires must be in a container 18" off the ground or in a designated fire pit.

Pack out all fire remains (no trace camping).

Carry out all trash.

Leave your area better than you found it.

Each unit should be properly supervised.

Units should provide own food.

Boys must not ride in the back of pickup trucks.
